Part 1. 759 pp. 8vo. Cont. half-calf with marbled boards. Some staining and discoloration but text generally clear and clean. Covers with wear typical for age, with corners bumped and spine with minor cracking. Appears to have been the property of N.F.S. Grundtvig as it has his name signed on endpaper and a decorative scroll of his(?) initials.

Bang himself was homosexual and suffered for it. 16mo half-calf with marbled boards and end papers. Nice condition.

Bewick and Son, Longman and Co, London, and Wilson and Co, York. Illustrated with numerous wood engravings by Thomas Bewick. Fine half-calf binding with marbled boards. The text clean and fresh, no foxing to speak of. All edges marbled.

Appointed to be read in Churches, Published by by Sir D. Hunter Blair and J. Bruce, Edinburgh, 1810. One volume bound in two. 12mo. [131 x 73 x 55 mm]. Contemporary straight-grained red goatskin, bound in a wallet style with a wide flap at the fore-edge of the front cover and a goatskin catch on the lower cover. The spines numbered within a circle in gilt, the flaps with a green goatskin doublure, marbled endleaves, gilt edges. Not in Darlow & Moule / Herbert or BLPC. Quires 2A-D consist of two parts: the Psalms (quires A-C) and Translations and Paraphrases, in Verse, of Several Passages of Sacred Scripture (quire D). Each part has its own title-page, and these four quires are present twice, having been bound in at the end of each volume. It is a fine copy. With the cont. signature of Hestine Petræus inscribed on endpaper.

- Frances Hodgson** *The Secret Garden*, William Heinemann, London, 1918, illust. William Robinson. 4th impression. Original green boards with gilt design. Spine remade. Internally fair and reasonably fresh with minor markings and foxing.
- Bugge, Thomas** *Reise til Paris i Aarene 1798 og 1799*, København 1800. First edition of this intriguing record of the author's journey to and from Paris, where he had been dispatched to debate the metric system. Bugge was a highly talented mathematician, later surveyor, tutor to Crown Prince Frederik, Professor of Astronomy, Royal Councillor and (three times) Vice-Chancellor of Copenhagen University. Cont. half-calf with marbled boards. Wear as expected – buffed and bumped corners, slight cracks to extremities of hinges, title and gilt on spine faded. Title page is missing but otherwise the text is fresh and clean, with folding tables and figures intact and in good condition.
- Caetano-Fabregat, Gilberto** *Poemas*, edited by Pizzi, Milan, fine limited edition of 500 of which this is no. 200. 53 pp. 25.5 x 32 cm. 27 poems. Soft card cover with title in green. With lengthy inscription to 'Mr F.C. Mason' of the British Embassy and with the author's visiting card on which there is also a lengthy note. Fine condition, the print clean and fresh. Some small tears to the (original) protective tissue paper cover.
- Carroll, Lewis** *Alice in Wonderland*, Hodder and Stoughton Limited, London, 1938. Illustrated by Gwynedd Hudson. Hardbound. Book Condition: Good. Cover with slight soiling, fading to spine and a single bump. Previous owner's bookplate and name. Otherwise clean and fresh. Full-page colour frontispiece and 11 full-page colour plates; full-page b&w illustrations, text illustrations, illustrated chapter headings, illustrated endpapers and front board. 222pp.
- Cervantes.** *Don Quixote* in 4 vols. Vellum. Small [4" x 6"] format. Printed by Joseph Barber, Tarragona, 1757. Well-used. A few pages missing in vol 4 but contemporary handwritten copy delightfully pasted in.
- Chang Da-chien** *Chinese Painting, with Original Paintings and Discourses on Chinese Art*, 1961. First edition. Edited by Kao Long-Mei, inscribed by the author. In fine case with bone clasps. Excellent condition. Some staining to inner side of case.
- Chaucer, Geoffery** *Canterbury Tales*, Garden City Publishing Company, 1934. A very good plus hard cover. De Luxe Edition. No dust jacket. 267 pages. With many full-page Rockwell Kent illustrations in black, white and bronze, plus also many small, partial page illustrations in black and white. Includes an introduction by Gordon Hall Gerould. This is a beautiful volume. Light tan clothbound boards with embossed title and author to front boards, and paste-in illustration to front, paste-in title to spine. Totally

tight and clean, with just very mild wear to front board and spine. Pages are very moderately age-darkened at edges.

Utz, Viking, New York, 1989. Hardcover. Book Condition: Fine. Dust jacket condition: Fine. First edition. This novel was shortlisted for the 1988 Booker Prize. Very tidy, clean copy. A (printer's?) ink mark across edges.

Christian V's

Danske Love, 'paa nye(?) oplagt ved' Casper Peter Rothe, 1755, 'efter Kongl. Allernaadigste meddelt Privilegium'. The first edition of this important legal work, which forms the basis for Danish law to this day, appeared in 1683. This edition is bound in full calf with four raised bands to spine, gilt designs, a red band with title. 15 x 9 cms. The binding is tight, the front has a 2 cm indentation, the result of old damage. Stamped twice with 'Hvedholm Bibliotek' (Hvedholm Castle Library). Previous owner's signature in old ink at base of frontispiece. Text very clean and fresh.

The Mysterious Mr Quin, London: Penguin, 1953 Penguin no. 931. A fairly rare copy of this book in good condition. Some wear, title page a little loose but otherwise very clean and good.

The Lotus-Pool of Memory, Michael Joseph, London, 1961. First English language edition. Translated by Joyce Emerson. Cloth. Book condition: very good. Dust jacket condition: good.

Churchill, Winston

The Unrelenting Struggle, The Continental Book Company AB, Stockholm, 1942. Hardcover. First Swedish edition. This is the wartime Swedish edition (published in English) of the second volume of Churchill's war speeches, containing 72 of Churchill's speeches, broadcasts, and messages to Parliament from November 1940 to the end of 1941. In 1942, The Continental Book Company was founded in Sweden "for the purpose of publishing English and American books in the original language for sale in as many countries on the continent of Europe as were able to take them." (Cohen, Vol I, p. 615) This is the only volume of Churchill's to be published by The Continental Book Company. Bound in quarter brown cloth over yellow-tan laid paper-covered boards, and a brown cloth corners. The Marlborough coat of arms is stamped in dark brown on the front cover. Condition of this book is very fine. The binding is square and tight, the contents clean with no previous ownership marks.

Tissues between the pages have folds. In places the printing has transferred in a slight shadow to previous page. A truly beautiful book.

From endpaper to endpaper each page is elaborately decorated in Pogany's distinctive style. Collection of letters preserved in the archives of the chateau d'Epoisse by 'a respectable family worthy of possessing such a precious heritage'. It is the family of M. de Guilaut, to whom most of these letters are addressed. Le comte de Guilaut was friend to Mme de S until his death in 1685, after which she continued to correspond with his widow, as did her(?) daughter. Only six of these letters survive. Many others from the mother and from the daughter were lost in 1793. Mme de S's property at Bourbilly was part of the Epoisse estate – hence the close relationship. She had inherited it from Bussy-Rabutin, and the chateau de Bourbilly was only 10 miles from Epoisse in the valley of the river Serain. Mme de S only visited occasionally.

Dickens, Charles

A very rare edition of this seminal work of ecclesiastical history, written in 326 after his participation in the synod of Tyre, where Eusebio presided. He was also a key consolatory figure in the council of Nicaea. His *Historia Ecclesiastica* is his most important work and probably the most valuable piece of early church history.

The Latin West came to know this Greek work through the translation of 403 by Rufinus of Aquieia. The 'Historia Ecclesiastica' was first published, together with the works of the later church historians Socrates Scholasticus, Sozomenus and Theodoretus in Paris in 1544 by Robertus Stephanus. The editor of this Latin edition of 1570 is the Swiss theologian and classical scholar Joannes Jacobus Grynaeus, 1540-1617, professor at the University of Basel. This is the earliest version of this edition that I have been able to source.

The original vellum with its embossed design containing indecipherable(?)text has been largely preserved and at some time remounted on boards. Internally, the text is surprisingly fresh, with the usual occasional stains and worm-holes. Some professional repair to individual pages. There is the signature of a previous owner dated 1638(?) on the title page.
